# Managers' Report August 2018

August has been a nice mild month weather-wise, which has allowed us to get on with some outdoor projects that needed to be completed. It was also great to have nice weather for our recent dune planting day. Although it's still quiet at this time of year, we've had a few campers in (especially on the weekend) taking advantage of this nice weather.

As just mentioned, our dune planting day took place on the 8<sup>th</sup> of August, with the entire senior school from Waipu Primary attending. 2000 Spinifex plants were enthusiastically planted by the students, which took two hours to do. They were then rewarded with hot chips and sausages for their efforts + a bottle of water. It is great to get the kids in as it educates them as to why we need to look after the dunes. No doubt we will have another planting day with the school again next year. Also, on the dunes, we've just had Michael Bergin at the camp spraying the foredune and back dune. This spraying will take place every 6 months from now on.

Anton, Lucy and Victoria attended the HAPNZ conference at the end of July, which was a worthwhile experience, as it always is. We heard a variety of excellent speakers on a wide range of topics relating to the tourism and in particular, the holiday park sector. We had many takeaways from the conference, one major one – it's becoming industry standard for internet to be free, and it is an absolute must for Millennials. By 2020 we should have fibre into the camp, and once we do we would like to make internet free. A 3<sup>rd</sup> VDSL line is soon to be installed which will further enhance our internet service within the camp.

We are pushing forward with our New Cabin plans and working through the logistics of the Entranceway Project with Trevor Murray from Modello Architecture. Trevor addressed the Board at last month's meeting and put forward a plan of action and various options available to us, which was much appreciated. Weathertightness inspections have taken place, so we are just waiting for the complete results, so we know how to proceed. Resource Consent extension has been applied for by Jackson Dream Planning.


ASH 68 has moved to site 108 and ASH 67 has moved to 95. We will be getting these empty sites re-grassed over the coming months, so they are good to go for the summer season.

We have implemented a new survey tool to get meaningful customer feedback. This is called CXI Survey Tool and is another idea we picked up at the recent HAPNZ conference. The customer takes the survey online and results are then emailed through to us weekly and monthly. There is a \$100 Prezzy Card up for grabs every quarter which is randomly drawn from all customers who complete the survey.







# Occupancy and Revenue – July 2018







Cabin occupancy in July saw a tiny (2%) decrease, but revenue was still up over \$5000 when compared YOY. This is due to our self-contained cabins (both 1 and 2 bedroom) remaining well occupied even over the winter months. Site occupancy and revenue increased slightly when compared with the previous July, this may be due to overall better weather.
