The school holidays are nearly upon us once again, with bookings looking good for this period. Hopefully if we get some decent weather we will pick up even more bookings.





We have just completed an intense week of training with all the staff, which was very comprehensive. As well as all the training, we had to provide a lot of information to Newbook for them to build our new system correctly. We will be going live with Newbook on Monday 17th of September. Once this happens, we will need to spend time cross-checking information and testing the new system. It's a big job and will take a bit of time and practise to get to grips with the new system. Newbook is a very efficient and sophisticated system, so it will be worth all the effort involved.

Occupancy and Revenue - August 2018









Cabin occupancy in August was down due to many of our cabins being blocked out for part of the month for renovations. Cabin revenue did not decrease greatly as we had the additional income from the new 2-bedroom self-contained cabins that were not in circulation this time last year. Site occupancy and revenue remained at similar levels when compared YOY for August.
