Manager's Report November 2024

GENERAL

November has been a busy hectic month for us at the camp. We have been busy getting the camp prepared for our summer rush, which is almost upon us.

Sadly our long-serving live-in groundsman Robert Dalebrook passed away suddenly in early November. This left the staff and ourselves reeling. Robert had been working at the camp for 14 years, and living onsite for 10 years. The entire camp family is feeling his loss, and no doubt will be for some time to come.

In the weeks since Robert's passing, we have been working to recruit a replacement for his role. We have fast-tracked the recruitment process compared to normal as we needed to have the position filled before peak season (the 20th of December). We advertised the position on SEEK and Trade Me Jobs and had a big response with over 120 applications in 10 days. We are pleased to announce Matthew Spragg has been offered the position, and we are looking forward to him starting with us in early December.



Aside from being busy with recruitment, there has been a lot happening around the camp and grounds to get ready for peak season. The camp and reserve have been sprayed for onehunga weed, and all the sites freshly marked out. The camp is looking great and ready to receive our guests.

The petanque court next to the north block eating area is now finished and signage has been installed. We just have to add some seating for players and spectators similar to what we have around the jumping pillow.



We've recently had a fence built to make the entrance to the camp look a lot tidier. This runs from the pump station at the beginning of the carpark (and covers this as it's quite unsightly) to the end of the car park by the garage. It then runs across the top of the carpark. It looks much tidier and gives privacy to the camp house.

The camp house has also had a tidy up with fresh paint, new carpet and several of the appliances have been replaced. The final touch will be new curtains which our new Facilities and Grounds Supervisor will choose and then put up. We have now done our rosters until early February and confirmed our casual staff for the summer, many of whom are returning for 2nd or 3rd summer. We will have over 20 staff on our roster over the peak period. Summer should operate like a well-oiled machine.



Our staff christmas party will take place on the 11th of December. We are keeping it lowkey and local this year and having dinner at the Pizza Barn. Spouses/partners are invited. It will be a much needed chance to get together and have a little fun after a tough month for everyone.



Next week we will be meeting with Adam Welsford from Maxar Architecture to discuss plans for the reception/shed refurbishment and extension, along with various other projects that will take place next year. The intention is he will have working drawings completed in the New Year so we can get these out to tender as soon as possible. Ideally, work will commence after easter 2025.

In the next few weeks leading up to Christmas, we will continue getting prepared with further staff training, arrival of supplies and last-minute organisation. We are looking forward to a hot, dry summer!


